1. CONTEXT

The collection development policy provides a framework by which to respond to the needs expressed by the users of the Library. The collection development policy provides clear statements which can be adapted to meet changing needs in the various areas of collection management; e.g. selection and de-selection of materials, acquisition of materials, and development of special collections.

The policy is framed by a focus on content and student requirements rather than format. However, the Library, as a strategic direction in its acquisition of information resources, has a preference for electronic, online information resources to cater for the University's multi campus locations and 24/7 access needs of our students.

The Library's present collection has been established by the parent institutions of Victoria University created in 1991 and incorporates the holdings of Western Melbourne Institute of TAFE (1995-1991), Western Institute (1987-1991) as well as Footscray Institute of Technology (1968-1991). The collections have been developed to support the institution's teaching and learning requirements. Increasingly the Library collection has responded to changes in information technology and trends in publishing and information dissemination. Collection building now involves both the acquisition of resources as well as the negotiation of access to electronic resources on a leased, annual basis. The Library is also now responsible for the collection of institutional research outputs and the maintenance of the Institutional Repository.

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2. **DEFINITIONS**

Special Collections – material that is housed in separate sequence to the main collection, either in open access or closed access, primarily to support the research programs at Victoria University.

Institutional Repository - Victoria University Institutional Repository (VUIR) aims to showcase, disseminate and manage the publicly available research and scholarly outputs from Victoria University staff and higher degree researchstudents.

3. STATEMENT OF POLICY

The Victoria University Library provides access to printed materials, electronic publications and other media formats to support the University's teaching and research programs. Both current and retrospective materials are collected. The coverage is national and international in scope. There is no restriction on the purchase of foreign language material although the collection is predominately English Language. All collection decisions to provide for the needs of our clients need to be balanced against available budget.
