

Academic Progress Regulations 2015

Part 1 - Preliminary

1. Objective

(1) The objective of these Regulations is to provide for an academic progress review to determine whether a student has maintained satisfactory academic progress and to support the outcomes of such reviews.

2. Authorising provision

These Regulations are made under the <u>Governance</u>, <u>Academic and Student Affairs Statute 2013</u> and sections 28, 29 and 30 of the <u>Victoria University Act 2010</u>.

3. Repeal and Commencement

- (2) The Academic Progress Interim Regulations 2013 are repealed when these Regulations come into operation.
- (3) These Regulations come into operation on 1 January 2016.

4. Definitions

In these Regulations-

- a. "academic progress" means a student's progress towards the successful completion of the academic requirements of the award in which they are enrolled;
- b. "academic progress decision" means a decision made under these Regulations regarding academic progress;
- c. "exclude" means to terminate a student's enrolment for failing to maintain satisfactory progress;
- d. "higher degree by research" means a postgraduate qualification undertaken primarily as part of a researchbased program of study;
- e. "higher education by coursework" means all undergraduate and post-graduate higher education awards undertaken primarily by coursework.
- f. "relevant college" means the College, or equivalent organisational unit, in which the student is enrolled and which is responsible for ensuring the academic requirements of an award;
- g. "student" means
 - i. a person enrolled at the University in a course leading to a degree, diploma, certificate, licence or other award; or
 - ii. a person whose study performance is being or is to be assessed by the University, notwithstanding that such a person is not enrolled at the University in a course leading to a degree, diploma, certificate, licence or other award.

Note

This definition of student is from section 3 of the <u>Victoria University Act 2010</u> and Council Resolution C2010 - 070.

h. "Unsatisfactory Progress" is where a student is considered to have not made satisfactory progress towards the

- academic progress requirements of the award in which they are enrolled.
- i. "Unsatisfactory Progress Panel" means a panel constituted to determine unsatisfactory academic progress concerns.

Part 2 - Academic Progress Review

5. Academic Progress Standards

The standards expected of students to meet satisfactory academic progress are set out in University policy and procedure.

6. Higher Degree by Research

- (4) The relevant college and/or Graduate Research Centre will regularly review higher degree by research students' academic progress.
- (5) Where the Dean, Graduate Research Centre (or their equivalent) considers that there are grounds to support a finding of Unsatisfactory Progress, the student will be provided with written notice and given an opportunity to request a hearing.
- (6) Where a student does not request a hearing, the student may be deemed to be making Unsatisfactory Progress and excluded by the Dean, Graduate Research Centre (or their equivalent).
- (7) Where a student requests a hearing, an Unsatisfactory Progress Panel will be convened to hear and determine whether a student has made Unsatisfactory Progress.
- (8) Where a student is found to have made Unsatisfactory Progress, the Unsatisfactory Progress Panel will:
 - a. allow the student to continue without conditions if this is justified in all of the circumstances;
 - b. impose a condition or conditions on the student's continued enrolment;
 - c. require the student to transfer their course (e.g. from a doctoral to a research master's degree); or
 - d. exclude the student.
- (9) A decision of the Dean, Graduate Research Centre or the Unsatisfactory Progress Panel is an academic progress decision for the purposes of the <u>Appeals Regulations 2014</u>.

7. Higher Education Coursework Programs

- (10) The University will regularly review the academic progress of each higher education coursework student.
- (11) Where a student is identified as having not met the academic progress standards or requirements for the first time, the student will be notified:
 - a. That the student has not made satisfactory progress; and
 - b. Of the requirement to engage in an academic intervention activity.
- (12) Where a student is identified as having not met the academic progress standards or requirements for a second time, an Unsatisfactory Progress Panel will be convened to hear and determine whether the student has made Unsatisfactory Progress.
- (13) Where a student is found to have made Unsatisfactory Progress, the Unsatisfactory Progress Panel may:
 - a. Allow the student to continue in their course without conditions if this is justified in all of the circumstances;

- b. Create and direct the student to undertake an academic performance improvement plan;
- c. Impose a condition or conditions on the student's continuing enrolment; or
- d. Recommend to the relevant College Dean that the student be excluded for unsatisfactory academic progress.
- (14) Upon the recommendation of an Unsatisfactory Progress Panel, the Dean of the relevant College may exclude a student.
- (15) Where requested by the student, the Dean of Students (or their equivalent) will review any decision made pursuant to sub-section (4) (a) to sub-section 4(c) or sub-section (5) and may make any decision that is capable of being made by the Unsatisfactory Progress Panel or relevant College Dean.
- (16) A decision made under sub-section (6) is an academic progress decision for the purposes of the <u>Appeals</u> <u>Regulations 2014</u>.

8. Vocational Education - TAFE

(17) The University may exclude a VET student for Unsatisfactory Progress in accordance with the relevant VET policies/procedures.
